As we close Fiscal Year 19 (April 2018—March 2019), we reflect and celebrate with all of you—our supporters, partners, members, and participants—the inspiring moments that you helped make possible.

Throughout 2018, we celebrated 60 years of serving the running community, and in 2019 we are celebrating 20 years of providing free youth programming. Thanks to our year-round race calendar, headlined by the TCS New York City Marathon, the largest marathon in the world, we are able to continue expanding our global impact.

As you read further, you'll encounter the inspiring stories of three remarkable individuals who embody the determination and strength required for achievement: Daniel, a participant in our Rising New York Road Runners Wheelchair Training Program who challenges himself on and off the roads; "Moose," a member of NYRR Striders who faced health issues head on post-retirement to improve his life; and Elizabeth, who entered the world of running

in high school through our Run for the Future program and continues her journey with the help of NYRR Race Free.

These are just a few of the individuals impacted and empowered through New York Road Runners' free programming, made accessible to them, and thousands like them, thanks to your support. Being able to share these stories of hope and triumph is not only our privilege, but also our responsibility. 

This dedicated group of adult runners has been adding meaning to their miles since 2002 and continues to inspire the next generation by example. The funds they raise at the TCS New York City Marathon, and other races in the city and throughout the world, ensure that young runners can participate in our programs and events at no cost. Posting a record-breaking year, more than 5,473 runners helped raise \$8.9 million, including \$6.6 million at the 2018 TCS New York City Marathon.

New York Road Runners Foundation expands beyond New York City to serve youth and schools nationwide, starting with a site in Florida.

BUILDING CONFIDENCE WHEREVER POSSIBLE

e believe all youth deserve the opportunity to experience the transformative power of running. And that starts with the skills, confidence, and motivation to be active for life. **Introduced in 2017** as an evolution of previous offerings based on latest research learnings in physical activity, Rising New York Road Runners teaches fundamental movement skills in an age- and ability-appropriate way. This introduction to healthy physical activity early on builds confidence and makes participants more likely to maintain an active lifestyle throughout adulthood.

In 2019, Rising New York Road Runners expanded to Puerto Rico. We were able to distribute free New Balance running shoes and launch the program at nine locations through partnerships with Puerto Rican Olympian Beverly Ramos and the Boys & Girls Clubs of Puerto Rico.

INVESTING IN THEIR FUTURE

e created the Rising New York Road Runners Youth Ambassadors program to give young runners a chance to share the special role that running plays in their lives—in their own voices, through special events and opportunities, and with their own communities. After graduating from the program, which is centered around speech fundamentals and public-speaking training workshops, the Rising New York Road Runners Youth Ambassadors are able to stand with NYRR and join us in our mission to help inspire people through running. Over the past year they've jumped in to help us ring the closing bell at the New York Stock Exchange on Wall Street, throw out the first pitch at Citi Field on Global Running Day, represent NYRR at a New York Islanders game, march in the TCS New York City Marathon Opening Ceremony, and even introduce the professional athletes at TCS New York City Marathon press conferences.

NYRR Run for the Future is formed to serve girls entering their senior year of high school with no prior engagement in organized sports.

FUELED WITH THE TOOLS TO TRIUMPH

e believe that confidence, commitment, perseverance, and goal-setting are all important traits necessary for success on the roads and in the classroom. That's why through the seven-week Run for the Future Program, NYRR helps build these skills in young female participants as they're introduced to running, health, and fitness. Generously started by Cathy and Marc Lasry, now supported by many, this initiative gets the girls on track to run their first road

race at the Percy Sutton Harlem 5K. In addition to running tips and training plans, the program teaches the importance of a healthy lifestyle and other valuable lessons through workshops with professionals, elite athletes, and industry leaders. The best part: Our participants develop noticeably greater levels of confidence and strength in mind, body, and spirit—not to mention receiving a \$2,000 college scholarship for completing the program! Since the beginning, 377 girls in total have completed Run for the Future.



Moose loved Striders because it allowed him to walk regularly, stay active, and channel extra energy. He met and connected with like-minded seniors who shared his interests. Walking with a group motivated him on days when he would have stayed inside and gave him a new lease on life. He noticed tangible health improvements, dropping 80 pounds, making it easier for him to keep up with his granddaughter. It's safe to say he won't be retiring his walking shoes any time soon.



OUR FLAGSHIP EVENT KEEPS OUR MISSION TOP OF MIND

ew things are more inspiring than the faces of runners crossing the finish line every year on the first Sunday of November at the TCS New York City Marathon, New York Road Runners' flagship event. Each of the (world-record breaking!) 52,813 finishers inspire all those around them through their journey to the finish line—including the millions of fans watching live from the course or via the global television broadcast. It's a beautiful celebration of our sport.

The TCS New York City Marathon is a founding member of the Abbott World Marathon Majors, a series consisting of six of the largest and most renowned marathons in the world in Tokyo, Boston, London, Berlin, Chicago and New York City.

This year, Daniel Romanchuk, Manuela Schär, Lelisa Desisa, and Mary Keitany led the field, and Team #MovedMe (new in 2018) highlighted the transformative power of running. All while the hearts and legs of 10,000 charity runners generated a record \$40 million.



Leaving NYRR with a legacy that will last a lifetime

he 2018 TCS New York City Marathon marked the end of an era as Peter Ciaccia, the globally respected race director of the TCS New York City Marathon and the president of events at NYRR, retired.

"Peter is going out on top, like so many of us dream about. He leaves a legacy that will last a lifetime. His passion for making sure every runner has a safe and positive experience, from the pros to the final finishers, is a big reason why New York Road Runners is the world's premier community running organization. And his attention to serving the community, from walks with seniors to runs with kids, is at the core of New York Road Runners' not-for-profit mission," said George Hirsch, chairman of the board of directors at NYRR.

During his 18-year tenure with NYRR, Ciaccia oversaw the planning and implementation of

more than 1,000 world-class running events and was instrumental in their redesign and production.

Under Ciaccia's leadership from before 2015 to 2018, the number of NYRR race finishers grew by 40%. Soaring growth was seen at the Popular® Brooklyn Half, now the largest half-marathon in the nation, and the TCS New York City Marathon, the largest marathon in the world.

Through his commitment to bettering our sport, Ciaccia has also left a lasting impact in the fight against doping in athletics through NYRR's Run Clean initiative, has helped grow the Abbott World Marathon Majors into the preeminent marathon organization on earth, and has made significant contributions to the safety and security of all spectator sports.

His daily presence is missed, but his impact continues to be seen and felt every step of the way—happy retirement, Peter!
